The "Sloopers", as they are now called, were Quakers who left Norway to allow them to practice their religion freely. At the time, the state-run Norwegian church mandated infant baptism, and military service was compulsory, both of which were contrary to Quaker beliefs. They were in contact with fellow Quakers in the US who made it clear they could practice their faith in the US, and they made the hard decision to leave Norway behind for the new opportunity.
